

### Some Food For Thought



I am exhausted, but in a remarkably good way. I am writing this on Saturday afternoon after spending an entire week with 58 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, and 6<sup>th</sup> graders. We got up early, went to bed late, and packed our days full of fun exciting activities such as pool time, zip line, climbing wall, air rifles, archery, and the giant swing. Sandwhiched between all the fun were many encounters with God. If you will, give me a few moments to share what our campers learned.

Every day our campers started the day around the flag pool. After a few calestinics and raising of the flags, one of our staff members lead our campers in a short devotional that established that days

theme. After breakfast our campers would meet in their clans (most years these are known as their camp families) where they would ask questions that would further prepare them for the lesson they were going to learn. When they were done with this, they would meet in the fireside room where we had worship followed by our lesson for the day. This year our theme was the Armor of God and we spent the week preparing our kids to be alert for the Unseen world that exist all around us. Finally, each evening ended with us walking back to Vespers where we unpacked a Bible story that showed men and women choosing (and not choosing) to suit up in the armor of God. Last night after our final Vespers, Jeanne Philippo said to me, "Another successful week of camp is finished." I have to agree. Adventure 456 in 2015 we a great success. Our campers learned and played hard all week long. And it was all possible because our camp staff was working together on mission. Our mission for the week was simply to love these kids and demonstrate what a life changing relationship with Jesus looks like. Our mission was successful because twenty-five of us came toghether, from several different churches, and worked as a team.



Started in the late 1970's by Larry and Diana Owens, many people from all over the country, have used their spiritual, physical, and monetary hands to reach the poor and destitute. Hope for a life with Christ is the focus of all those working, visiting and receiving help. Our own Barb Grever has made numerous


short term mission trips to assist in the ongoing work of this vital mission (including a trip in July 2015).



West Side has partnered with NWHCM on multiple occasions. Most recently we sponsored a Bible program during our Vacation Bible School were our children purchased 33 Bibles. Also during the week we organize at Butler Springs our campers raised \$543 to help purchase baby formula for use at Mole St. Nicolas.

Some of the many on-going programs: 7 churches and schools scattered all over the North West, Bible College to educate the teachers and ministers, an orphanage of over 130 young people ages 3-16, a birthing clinic, medical clinics, including eye care, dental, and pre-natal, Gran Morn-a 40 bed home of the elderly, visiting specialty surgical teams, and English classes.


