




Mid-Atlantic Christian University (or MACU for short), is located in Elizabeth City, North Carolina. They strive to transform a supportive and growing community of ordinary people into extraordinary Christian leaders. At MACU, students can earn a bachelor's degree in biblical studies, youth and family studies, Christian arts and science, counseling, entrepreneurial leadership, and elementary education. MACU's academic program is organized into two schools – the School of Undergraduate Studies and the School of Professional Studies.



On February 1, 2018, Gregory D. Hand, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Mid-Atlantic Christian University, announced that John W. Maurice, Jr. has been appointed as the fourth President of MACU. Maurice was appointed Interim President effective July 1, 2017. As interim, he had also continued serving as Vice President for Institutional Advancement, a position he has held since January 2014.

Maurice follows the University's third president, Dr. D. Clay Perkins, whose duties ended June 30, 2017. Prior presidents have been George W. BonDurant, who founded the school as Roanoke Bible College in 1948, and William A. Griffin, the second president. – Exert taken from MACU press release

Some Food for Thought

This is article #2 in our series about The Bible.

When I was in college as a student at Mid-Atlantic Christian University (our featured mission for this month, see the previous page) I had a professor who compared reading the Bible in English to kissing your spouse through a screen door. When we read the Bible in English, we are not reading Scripture in it's original language. The Bible was originally written in the common language spoken in their day. In the Old Testament the common language of the original audience was Hebrew, with a few interspersing of Aramaic. In the New Testament the common language of that era was Greek, so the New Testament was written in Greek.

As English speakers, it is important for us to have a copy of the Bible in our native tongue. We read and learn best when we can read and hear in our native language. However, when translating any text from one language to another some of the nuances is lost. We get the meaning and the intention, but there is something missing. Like kissing your spouse through a screen door. You know you are kissing, but there is still something missing, the full effect.

As English speakers we are blessed with many different translations of the Bible. While an exact number cannot be given, some experts believe there are close to 900 various English translations and paraphrase's. Some are more popular than others. Some have served their purpose for a time, and others have simply not found wide spread use. We are completely blessed that we have so many options when it comes to reading the Bible in our language.

Something else we have to keep in mind as American's is that we are not the only English speakers reading the English translations. There are English speakers around the world, and many translations are translated so that the most number of people can read them. So, there may be words selected that are not common to us.

For example, several years ago when I was going though my daily Bible reading I chose the English Standard Version. This is a terrific translation of the Biblical text. But, they used a word that I do not use in my vernacular. The word was sojourn. Now, from the context I understood what it meant. But, it was a foreign word to me, and I wanted a definition for it. It means to stay some where temporarily. In America, we typically do not use this word. We might say, "I was just visiting for a while." So, why was this word picked, instead of visiting? Because, it wasn't translated into English just for us.

It is a wonderful thing that we have the Bible translated in our language for us to read. But remember, while we can get all the intent, we are still missing out on the full effect. If you really want to read the Bible the way it was written, you need to learn Greek and Hebrew. For those that don't want to do that, praise God that He has blessed us with so much easy access to His Word in our language.

Next month we will look at some of the English translations and explore what is good, and maybe not so good, about them. – In Christ's Service, Michael
