### Did I pray today?

When you look around the building God has given us to worship in and see all the “things” that are done before each service or class, you can ask yourself one question; “Did I pray today?”

We, as a church family, have had some difficulties in the past few years. I would say most of these difficulties come from the fact Satan can sense there are great things coming for the West Side family and he wants to do what he can to stop it. Starting in mid-May, all the Elders and Michael have been getting together each Monday morning at 7 to pray. We don't discuss church business... we pray. Each Elder will list an item they would like everyone to pray for; then we separate for 15 minutes and pray silently. After our silent time of prayer, we come together and we pray out loud together. ## Missions News

One of our own, Jordan Meilstrup, is near the end of his one year commitment to working on the Jesus Film with CRU. The following is some basic information on CRU



Formerly known as Campus Crusade for Christ, CRU, whose purpose is helping to fulfill the Great Commission in the power of the Holy Spirit by winning people to faith in Jesus Christ, building them in their faith and sending them to win and build others and helping the body of Christ to do evangelism and discipleship through a variety of creative ways.

They are committed to the centrality of the cross, the truth of the Word, the power of the Holy Spirit and the global scope of the Great Commission. CRU offers spiritual guidance, resources and programs tailored for people from all cultures in every walk of life through many diverse outreaches, including:

- 2,400 campus ministries engaging more than 82,000 involved students on U.S. college campuses.
- Partnership with more than 2,000 churches and organizations to reach America's poor with the resources they need to survive and overcome the challenges of poverty.
- Marriage and family outreaches to 12 million people annually through media, conferences and locally hosted events.
- Athletic outreaches in 85 nations and 200 college campus in the U.S. along with sports media that touches the lives of an estimated 100 million people annually.
- Ministry to military installations and communities in 50 states as well as deployed units (ships, flight lines and foxholes)
- The Jesus Film, shown in over 1,300 languages on every nation in the world. To date it is responsible for 6.5 billion exposures to the gospel and 230 million indicated decisions for Christ.

CRU was originally founded as Campus Crusade for Christ in 1951, when Bill and Vonette Bright began the ministry on the UCLA campus. God had given him a vision portraying the total fulfillment of the Great Commission throughout the world. They are only a part of God's workforce to accomplish that, but are passionate about their part and how they can help others achieve their parts. From the beginning, CRU has sought to be a caring community as well as a community on mission.
