


March Madness Most Valuable Verse

West Side Projects Update

Starting with this newsletter, we will now have monthly updates on various projects and happenings around West Side. If you have a topic that you would like an update on, we encourage you to ask, but also feel free to let an elder or staff member know, so we can make it part of this new feature in the newsletter.

Outdoor Sign - The board met in February and made some decisions on the outdoor sign. A vendor has been picked after reviewing design drafts from two companies. The board decided to get two identical signs for the property. The signs will be located in spots very close to the temporary signs that are up currently. There are a few minor changes to the draft we reviewed and by the time you are reading this newsletter, we hope to have a final draft for the church to approve. We anticipate making that final approval in early March and getting word on how long it will take them to make and install the signs. We do believe that the funds that were given to us from the city for our last sign, plus the funds they gave us for the land, will cover the cost of both signs which is very exciting!

Interior Designer - In January we approved bringing in an interior designer to help us with refreshing our current building and to give some suggestions on how we can better use our space. A group of six people met with Jennifer from the McKnight Group, who works with churches, and we discussed the entire building. We then received suggestions from Jennifer. The group of six, the elders and spouses and staff all reviewed the suggestions and made a list of updates to consider for the building. The board also reviewed the list. Currently we are getting prices and estimates on the projects for a March 3rd meeting. At this meeting we will review the costs for the projects and start prioritizing and



planning. Once that is complete we will either call a special board meeting or meet at the regular April meeting to approve what will happen and when.

It should be noted that although some of the work will be done by us, we are looking at having third parties come in to do a number of projects so that the overall project will be done in a reasonable amount of time. We also hope to get involvement of West Siders so be ready when those chances come! Some of the higher-level projects that we are looking at and considering are:

- Repainting of the entire main level which includes the sanctuary, the lobby, the fellowship hall and the lower level
- Doing some remodeling of the lobby which includes turning the coat closet into the Welcome Center, creating a new coat closet, re-purposing the conference room, widening the entrance of the conference room and moving the door to Cheryl's office
- New lighting, organization and storage in the fellowship hall
- Update paint in the nursery
- New interior signage
- New lights in the lobby and by sanctuary windows
- New window treatments in sanctuary
- New flooring for sanctuary stage
- Replacing all exterior doors except for main entrance
- Replacing the yellow windows in the Fellowship Hall
- Updating existing technology throughout the church
- Resurfacing the entire parking lot with new asphalt

No matter what gets decided, it was a consensus from the interior designer and everyone who has reviewed the ideas that we must clean (purge) the church and get rid of everything that is not needed. As you are reading this, you will have noticed that the purging is already in process.

Two other important notes to mention: There will be some of you, and rightly so, that will say yes there is a plan but will we really act upon it at all or in a reasonable amount of time? Based on the discussions so far, I believe the answer is



yes, so hold on because after 20 years it is time to freshen things up a little. The other point is cost. We obviously need to be smart and make a game plan and communicate that game plan. We do have some funds to work with but we will disclose the project plans as they are created.

These are exciting times and we encourage questions, discussions and involvement. So as of now, feel free to search out a staff member or elder and ask your question or give your suggestion. Until next month, please continue to pray for our church and thank you for all you do. ~ Eric

Mike and Debbie Flinchum have been busy with church leadership training at the Northern border town of Mai Sai, Thailand. This was the 15th year for this seminar that was attended by preachers, elders, deacons and Bible teachers. Mike taught follow-up lessons from his class on "Discipleship". They had 130 church leaders from the Thai and Myanmar sides



of the border. They also had Church leadership training at the Western border town of Mae Sot, Thailand. Around 50 church leaders attended this seminar. Most of them were preachers, elders, deacons, and Bible School teachers in refugee churches. Two of Mike's close friends, Larry and Gary McGuire were also present at this seminar. There was also a medical team form F.A.M.E.

Mike and Debbie have been in Chiangmai, Thailand since 2006. Mike and Debbie served on the teaching staff of Lanna Theological Center. LTC has a goal to train nationals to evangelize their own people groups. Bible college classes are taught to students in a classroom setting and then they are taken to local villages for the practical aspects of their studies.

With the help of their students, the Flinchum's work in discipling the hill tribe orphan children and evangelizing among the Thai's and the unreached hill tribes' people. They hold weekly worship services for the students as well as the surrounding communities.

Some, like the welcome center, coat closet, and repurposing of the conference room, are a little bigger, and we believe will help with some Sunday morning traffic flow and be a better use of our space.

What is driving this process is twofold. First, our building is now over twenty years old. In some ways our lighting and window treatments look dated. In other ways, things are wearing out. Like any home or retail store, after twenty years of use, it is time to make some updates.

However, it is our second reason that is much more important.
