


### Pumpkin Gems

1 Yellow cake mix3 eggs½ cup oil

1 tsp. baking soda 2 tsp. cinnamon 1 can pumpkin



Preheat oven to 350. Blend together all ingredients. Fill paper-lined mini muffin pans 2/3 full. Bake for 15 minutes. Cool, then frost with Cream Cheese frosting.





## **Comenserve**

ComeNServe is an auxiliary of the Christian Churches/Churches of Christ whose purpose is to (1) minister to the spiritual and humanitarian needs of Muslims, (2) provide a bridge of understanding and communication between Christians and Muslims, and (3) facilitate the cooperation of Christians and Muslims in projects of education and humanitarian relief. The congregation in Albania has grown to almost 100 in attendance. Currently there is a church plant in Kosova in conjunction with the medical clinic there. CNS also assists Afghanistan refugees in Iran. The first annual conference was held earlier this year with the location and dates not published because of security concerns. It was well attended and well received by those in attendance. CNS is one of the few organizations in the USA that ministers to Muslims around the world.
