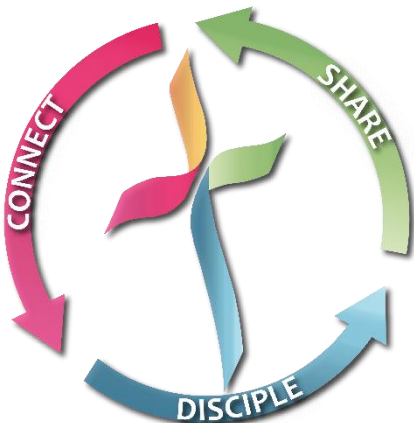

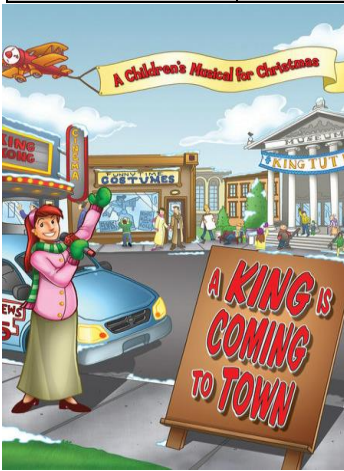

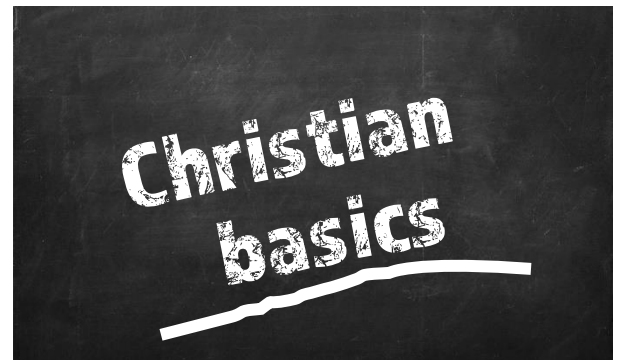

Missions News



The Christian Restoration Association



The Christian Restoration Association has been helping churches since 1922. Their mission: "To be a helping hand to the churches." Christian Restoration Association brings a lot of preaching and teaching to the table. They preach for the unity of all followers of Christ. They promote New Testament Christianity. The C.R.A. has many specific ways it provides services; Recycled Riches, Christian Bible Institute, Evangelists, Bible Conferences and Seminars, plus the publication of The Restoration Herald.

The trustees of the Christian Restoration Association, leaders in churches of Christ/Christian churches, are the trustees of the Christian Bible Institute. The Christian Bible Institute is thus a ministry of the CRA and functions under the Christian Services Department. It is not designed as a profit-making program and is in fact subsidized by the general fund of the CRA. The fees charged are very modest to enable all who so desire to be able to prepare themselves for greater service in the Lord. Appreciation gifts above the required fees are appreciated.

Christian Bible Institute was organized January 1, 1945, in Creswell, North Carolina. Its purpose was to offer special training for elders, deacons, teachers and other Christians to help provide more proficient leadership for the churches. Men desiring to preach the Word, though unable to attend a Bible college, gave occasion for the development of a ministerial course. This course was designed particularly for those who desired a home study opportunity and is not in competition with resident Bible colleges.

An agreement was made on June 1, 1966, between Perry F. Baldwin, founder of Christian Bible Institute, and the Christian Restoration Association which authorized the CRA to administer Christian Bible Institute, maintaining its original purpose.

Christian Bible Institute bases our approach on the truths of the Scriptures among which are the divinity of Jesus Christ, the Son of the living God; the Scriptures written by men inspired by the Holy Spirit; and the church as the body of Christ which He ransomed by His personal sacrifice and commissioned to preach the gospel to all the world.

January 22 – 24, 2019 CRA will sponsor (along with the Central Florida Ministers) Action In Acts. In Kissimmee, Florida. Some Food for Thought

This is article #5 in our series about *The Bible*. Our house is celebrating it's 100th year, having been built in 1918. Our family room, an addition added to the house sometime in the 1920's, had a very challenging layout. With six windows, a built-in window seat, two unusable closets, and French doors that provide access through our dinning room, we have struggled to set up this room. For several years we have wanted to remove the window seat and closets to regain the thirty-eight square feet.

The original floors in this room were red oak pieces, individually laid, and nailed in by hand. It was a small space, so I followed their example and did the work by hand. I am thankful this was a small job. Those men who laid this original floor, nailing in each individual nail by hand, have my admiration. My little bit of work, with a nail gun (I cheated), was frustrating enough.

My house is only one hundred years old. But the advances in technique and technology in the last one hundred years is astounding. From hand tools to power tools. Keep the idea of change in mind when you read your Bible. The newest events recorded for us are just turning 2,000 years old. That's a lot of time and a lot of cultural change. While the message and the truth of God's Word does not change, the context and culture of the time certainly has. Just think of your own life time, and all the changes you have personally witnessed in society.

Something we must keep in mind when we read the Bible is the changes from their world to ours. Understanding this, helps us understand the Bible and its message more fully. Take this passage from Galatians for example, *"But when the time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under law, to redeem those under law."* Galatians 4:4-5 NIV. In this passage the Apostle Paul is saying, when the world was perfect, when everything was just right, Jesus was born. So, what was the context of that day? Well, for the first time since the Tower of Babel, there was a common language spoken throughout the Roman empire, Greek. On top of that, in Israel, there was political upheaval. They were looking for a Messiah (they just didn't get the type they were looking for). In addition, the Romans had established a road system that aided the spread of the gospel. Because of the exile centuries before, there were Jews scattered all through the empire. When the time was right, Jesus was born. Understanding this context is important to understanding this passage.

This lesson is true throughout the Bible. Something we have to do is to remember to travel from our time to theirs. When we do, we begin to see Scripture through their eyes. We see the message that was being presented in their context, with their problems, with their situations. We get the complete picture. But we can't stop there. We have to then travel back to our time and take the lesson we learned and apply it to our lives, in our culture and our context.

The Bible is a wonderful resource that God has given us. Using it to it's fullest is a great challenge. This is just one additional element to keep in mind as we cherish God's Word. ~ In Christ's Service, Michael
